# **Puppets Teach About Germs**

JDA is pioneering an innovative approach to teaching young children basic hygiene practices.

The program for 1st through 4th graders was the first of its kind in Af-

ghanistan, and children and teachers alike enjoyed the presentation. Students followed the story of a girl who got sick because she was eating unwashed fruit, didn't wash her hands and her home was not clean.

Children watched and listened to the speaking microbe puppet and understood how it came from a dirty environment, especially latrines and how the microbe could spread disease.



The kids were also introduced to a bio-sand filter, how it works and the importance of drinking clean water. Each school received four bio-sand filters, and the school's technical staff learned how to take care of them. All kids and teachers who participated in the program received a special coloring book about the importance of hand washing.
